## Echoes from the Grave

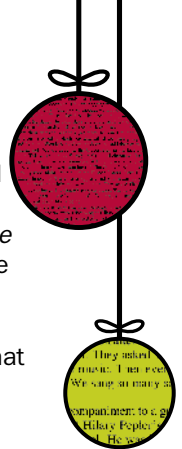
*S.D. Tooley*

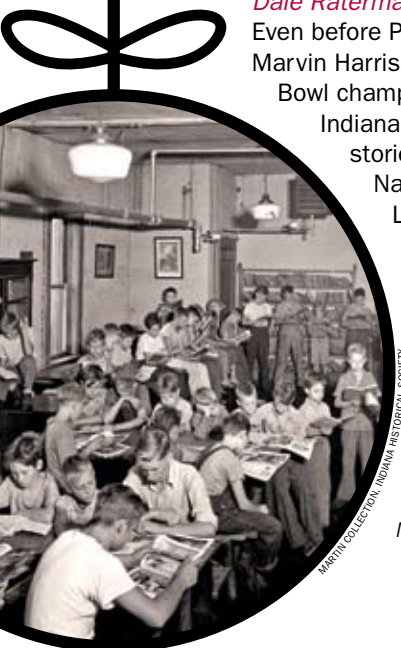

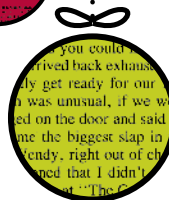
